Recent industry innovations let you address hair-care concerns from the comfort of your own home.

id you know that you can give your hair a major glow-up without ever leaving your house? Thanks to recent launches in the hair-care space—from sciencebacked thickening treatments to products that promise repair from the inside out to upgrades in at-home colouring systems—your best hair days ever may require no more than a mere trip to your bathroom.

THICK AND FAST "Patients come to me with hair-loss concerns every single day-literally," says Dr. Neera Nathan, a Boston-based dermatologist. "For years, I'd offer the same two or three treatments in my clinic-minoxidil, platelet-rich plasma and sometimes spironolactone. I'd never heard of plant-based ingredients that could actually help." In 2020, Nathan was introduced to hair-care brand Vegamour, which just launched at Sephora Canada this January. "I was pleasantly surprised to learn that there is data showing that topical ingredients like caffeine, turmeric and red clover can stimulate hair growth." In addition, Vegamour's Gro Revitalizing Shampoo and Conditioner are formulated with Karmatin, a vegan alternative to keratin. "It coats the hair, making it instantly look thicker, and stays on for three or four washes," she says. Vancouver-based hair-care brand Xyon also offers products to "stimulate hair growth and reduce shedding, using natural DHT-blocking ingredients like saw palmetto," says Dr. Simon Pimstone, clinician and founder of the brand. "DHT is a form of testosterone that can contribute to female pattern hair loss, and our Nourish Hair Oil is designed to reduce inflammation and lower levels of DHT in the scalp."

Function of Beauty Pro Bonding Leave-In Treatment, \$38

THE NAME'S BOND "Bonds are important for moisture, elasticity and shine," says Peter Schuetz, measurement science leader at Unilever. There are three types of bonds in our hair-ionic, covalent and hydrogen-and they act as a bridge between proteins that make up the hair fibre, so having a strong, healthy bridge is crucial for hair to look its best. While hydrogen bonds are the most abundant, they are also the weakest and easily broken or damaged by external factors such as heat. "The new Nexxus Amino Bond line has been designed to repair hydrogen bonds, thanks to the formula's inclusion of amino acids that are small enough to penetrate deep into the hair cortex," says Schuetz. Whether it's in the form of shampoos, conditioners or masks, bond-repair technology will be taking over the hair-care aisle because these products not only rebuild broken bonds but can also prevent further internal damage.

## TRUE COLOURS
